Nevin Aladağ - INTERLOCKING

Exhibition from March 10 until June 30, 2024

Nevin Aladağ (*in Van, Turkey, lives and works in Berlin) is one of the most internationally renowned artists of our time. She has been represented at contemporary exhibitions like the Venice Biennale and *documenta 14* with her installations, performances and video works. Music and sound, dance, textiles and ornaments play a key role in her work.

The survey exhibition *Nevin Aladağ – INTERLOCKING* in the Max Ernst Museum draws lines of connection with textile collages, sound sculptures, installations and videos between different patterns of artistic creation and their sociocultural backgrounds. The linking of such contexts is a main theme in Nevin Aladağ's extensive work.

The artist has produced new works specifically for the exhibition in the Max Ernst Museum. These include two works of the series *Color Floating*, in which she covers lamps with coloured nylon stockings, thus playfully combining everyday materials into a new aesthetic. In the *Social Fabric, Floating Leaves* series, she weaves various textiles to form a "utopian rug" that visually brings together the origins of the materials from distinct cultures.

Nevin Aladağ's latest sculpture series Resonator consists of objects comprises components of various string, wind and percussion instruments – from harp, mandolin and glockenspiel through acoustic and bass guitar to drum, didgeridoo, pan flute, tuba and trumpet. The sculptures, as fantastic generators of sound, seem surreal. The *Resonator Strings*, *Wind and Percussion* will be regularly activated by musicians during the period of the exhibition.

The installation *Carpet Ball Game* invites visitors to literally play with the artworks in an indoor basketball court themselves. The gymnastics balls covered with crochet work, the *Crochet Balls*, provide visitors with mobile seating. In addition site-specific installations with the *Best Friends* flags can also be seen outside the museum. The *INTERLOCKING aktiv* space placed in the middle of the show invites visitors to try out the processes used by Nevin Aladağ themselves, such as the knotting of macramé wall hangings.

The exhibition is on display from March 10 until June 30, 2024, and curated by Madeleine Frey, Director of the Max Ernst Museum Brühl des LVR and Co-Curator Sophia Naumann, Curatorial Assistant.

INTRODUCTORY TEXT

In the overview exhibition INTERLOCKING, Nevin Aladağ weaves her oeuvre to form a course of perception and participation. She presents patterns of the everyday, which she stylises, multiplies and combines, in the ornamental works. In this way they develop a new visual impact. Structured in a similar way are the rug works, which combine patterns and forms in a collage-like fashion, thus resulting in a haptic overall composition. In the video works, she abstractly captures the sound of the cities, and dancers leave traces on the copper plates with their stiletto heels that generate their own sound. You can participate yourself in the Teppichballspiel (Carpetball Game). The artist emancipates the exhibition space and the artworks by calling upon, you, the audience, to play and to perceive art with all your senses. The seemingly surrealistic musical instruments are not only collaged objects, but are instead regularly activated by musicians, so that another level of experience is also added here.

The interlocking is also made evident in the exhibition through various patterns, site-specific installations and the activation of different artworks. In media across genres, such as photography, sculpture, performance, installation and video, the artist breaks open classic attributions and overcomes practised hierarchies.

At the level of content, she calls upon us to free ourselves from normative appearances and poses questions revolving around identity and transformation.

BIOGRAFIE

Nevin Aladağ (*1972 in Van, Turkey, lives and works in Berlin) is one of the most renowned international artists of our time and exhibited at *documenta 14* and the Biennale di Venezia 2017, among other venues. Her works are found in important collections like, for example, Centre Pompidou in Paris, the SF MOMA in San Francisco or in the Städtische Galerie im Lenbachhaus in Munich.

The artist grew up in Stuttgart and went to Munich in 1993 to study sculpture at the Akademie der Bildenden Künste in Munich. She moved to Berlin in 2000, where she has since lived. She has been professor for "Sculpture in Motion" at the Dresden University of Fine Arts since 2020.




